President's Message

Dear Sisters,

Every time I start out to Kentucky, history and memories flood my brain. This past October, I had a wonderful two weeks visiting family and friends, reading, and resting. Every time I start out to drive there or to drive back, I begin to wonder if I will be able to drive the whole way, 525 miles. I was able to do it again. But half way there my car's dash gave me the message that I needed to have my tires rotated and my oil changed, an unexpected and unwanted notification. Nothing to do but to keep on "going along and singing my song!" I travel on 40 West until I reach Nashville, Tennessee, where I go across town on the Briley Parkway North, pass by Opryland, and then exit onto Interstate 24 West. I had prayed to be able to get on 24 while it was still light. I did get that done and exited I 24 on 431 North. As I rolled into Logan County, Kentucky, that just had celebrated its 225th anniversary, I passed the field where Andrew Jackson fought his duel and killed Dickinson over a remark made about Jackson's wife Rachel. A few miles down the road, I crossed over Red River near where the Second Great Awakening (1800) began. The Reverend James McGready, a Presbyterian minister who had left Guilford County because of his fiery preaching, was a force in this revival.

His stone home in Russellville stood through my childhood and teen years. It was once the poorhouse. Johnny Cash later bought it and took the stones to his farm in Davidson County, Tennessee, Nashville.

Just as personal anniversaries are important, so are the anniversaries of Delta Kappa Gamma. Consider these: Last year Beta Delta celebrated its 50th birthday. We celebrated at our first meeting and even had a cake. Founding members who are still with us are Dr. Lois Edinger, Miss Hazel Perritt, Miss Betty McNairy, Ms. Helen Medlin, and Dr.

Jane Mitchell. October 27 was the 83rd anniversary of Eta State. And our organization is approaching 90 years. Dr. Annie Webb Blanton was the founder of Delta Kappa Gamma in Austin, Texas, in 1929. On the shoulders of these

founding members, contemporary Beta Delta rests.

Vegetable Lasagna Recipe

Ingredients

- Sauce Heat 2qts of heavy cream and season to taste with salt, pepper and garlic. Thicken with slurry (mixture of corn starch and water)
- Veggies -Sauté in pan with olive oil one pkg. of mushrooms, one onion, squash & zucchini (about 3each). Season to taste with salt, pepper, garlic, thyme, oregano and basil. Cook veggies until almost done.
- I pkg of fresh spinach do not cook....leave the spinach raw.
- 8oz. Package of lasagna noodles cook in salted boiling water appox. 7 minutes. Drain and cool.
- 2-3 packages of parmesan cheese

At our last Board Meeting, we were treated to a delicious vegetable lasagna. Many people asked for the recipe, so courtesy of Rinda Estes, here it is. NOTE: Please note that this recipe doesn't have exact measurements on all the ingredients.....it's one that can be tweaked to your own taste! Hope everyone enjoys! -Rinda



In a 9x13 inch baking dish cover bottom with a thin layer of sauce. Layer noodles, vegetables, fresh spinach, parmesan cheese (no real measurement of cheese....just sprinkle generous amount on top of spinach) then cover with sauce. Repeat layers. On top layer remainder of noodles and place thinly sliced tomatoes. Sprinkle with parmesan cheese and panko plain bread crumbs. Bake at 350 for 30-45 minutes (until golden brown). Let it stand for 10 min before slicing.

Member Spotlight: Visit with Former President Lois Edinger

"When I was initiated into DKG in 1965, there was only Alpha chapter in Greensboro. I believe it was that year or the following that Alpha was divided into 4 chapters. Many of the older members elected to stay in Alpha and the rest were divided among Beta Beta, Beta Delta and Beta Gamma. Therefore, Lois, the first President of Beta Delta, would have been president in 1966 or 67. She was a professor of Education, specializing in Social Studies education. She was always active in NEA and served as President of the organization in 1965 (I looked it up).

She was always active in Beta Delta and served as parliamentarian until health issues intervened. I used to tease her that First Baptist Church couldn't open its doors without her being present. She taught a Bible class there for many years and still tries to attend when possible. She is currently at Abbotswood." – Jane Mitchell



CHIP ACTION NEEDED

The Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) was allowed to expire at the end of September. This program covers approximately 9 million children from families whose income does not allow them to qualify for Medicaid but who do not make enough money to afford regular health insurance. You are urged to contact your Senators and Representative to urge them to extend the expiration date of CHIP. The toll free number to reach these legislators is given at "Contacting Your Legislator."



LEGISLATION OF INTEREST

A bill has been introduced in the House which would prohibit the manufacture, possession or obtaining parts which would convert a rifle to a machine gun. (H.R.3999). H.R.899 which would eliminate the Department of Education and H.R.861 would eliminate the Environmental Protection Agency. Both were introduced and referred to committee. If passed both would take effect December 2018. Currently a House resolution is being considered which would set budgets both for the upcoming year as well as making recommendations for budgets for fiscal years 2019-2027 (H.Con.Res.71). Congress is also beginning to start zeroing in on revisions to the tax code. One sticking point is not allowing tax payers to deduct state taxes on their federal income tax.
